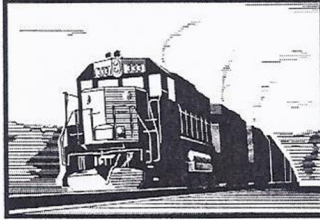

MODULE GROUP

The Module Group will set up and operate the HO modules and Bruce Hukill's N scale layout at the Toy Train and Model Railroad Flea Market, presented by the Youngstown Model Railroad Association, at the Salem Center Plex, 1098 N. Ellsworth Ave., Salem, OH 44460 on Sunday, January 8, 2017. **We will setup the modules Saturday, January 7, 2017 at 1:00 PM.** There is a large door at the end of the building where we will be located and will use a 8' X 100' space. **Please confirm to me that you will be there to help setup. We need extra help due to the limited time to setup. Carpooling might be an option.** This show was formerly located at McMenamy's near Warren. This event may be repeated on April 9, 2017. Those details have not been confirmed.

The next show for the HO and NTRAK Modules will be Thursday, Friday and Saturday, March 16, 17 and 18, 2017 at the Midwest Narrow Gauge Show located at the same location as the Portland Locomotive Works where we had our October meeting. It is in the old school building, Greenford Space Center, 7600 W. South Range Road, Salem, OH 44460. This is a Division 1 cosponsored event. Details are pending.

We had a Module Construction Clinic at the November meeting. In preparation, I had to build a module from scratch, minus gluing together, so I could show all the pieces. I also cut extra pieces for a future module. My thanks go to Jim Williams for his assistance at the meeting.

Those of you who want a module; you need to contact me so I can order electrical components and more lumber. See my email and phone numbers below. We will schedule a date to build the module(s). The final price will be around \$110.00 for the kit.

We are hoping that we can build a T-module and Outside curves to allow the operation of an unused loop, or, add a yard when connected to another group. *Hopefully, we will have more places to show next year. We are always looking for more venues and opportunities to show the modules. Please contact anyone of us below if you have a lead.*

We welcome everyone to use our throttles, engines and rolling stock, anytime we are operating. If you have equipment that you want to run, bring it. It must be DCC ready and we can help program a new locomotive to get you started. If we can get you to do that, we hope to convince you to join us regularly. We are looking for new ideas. Those who build a 4' x 2' module with scenery, which is eight square feet minimum, can apply for the "Golden Spike" and other AP awards.

The Division portion of the 50-50 raffle is placed in the module fund. This fund is shared with the HO and NTrak groups as needed for division owned equipment. Privately owned modules and equipment are the responsibility of the owner. All request for funds are to be presented to the Module Chairman.

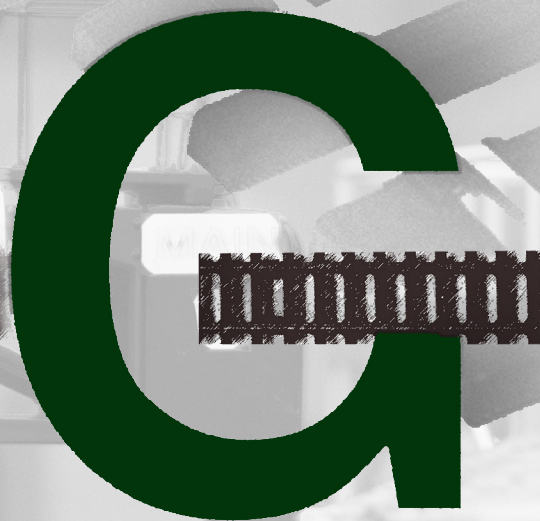

Division 1 member Josh Cohen is anything but a lone shark model railroader. This writer's first visit to Josh's 12' x 15' O scale basement layout was briefly interrupted by a computer video interview with a model railroader in California. No worries, Josh quickly switched us over to his cell phone so we could continue operating and talk trains with a friend from the west coast at the same time. Josh has definitely embraced social media as a tool to share his love of trains with people near and far.

Like many of his generation, Josh began his love of trains by playing with *Thomas and Friends*. This evolved into O-27, O gauge hi-rail and HO. His *Coal and Steel Railroad* and *Pennsylvania Railroad Central Region Lake Division* has blocks controlled with working Pennsy position lights and turnouts powered with Tortoise switch machines.

Being in high school, Josh's train budget is limited. This doesn't stop progress, with realistic scenery and scratch built structures found throughout the layout. Josh also takes pride in his discarded trains and with a little time gets them up and running.

With his Division 1 membership Josh belongs to *The Canfield Model Railroaders of the Erie Railroad Museum* and participates in *YouTube Model Builders*, various *Facebook* groups, blogs and forums. Through his use of social media Josh has become a true ambassador to the hobby to many throughout the area and the world.

The business meeting adjourned at 2:38 pm.

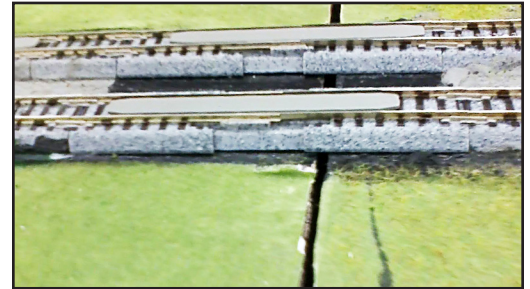
N SCALE NEWS

NTRAK Layout at SIR TROY'S – The display and running of the n scale modules at Sir Troy's, December 9 – 16, was successful irregardless of the snowy and cold weather. About 75 visitors made it past all the LEGOS to where we were setup. Being setup for a week allowed us to operate and checkout lots of different engines and cars. Also, we were able to fine tune and resolve a number of layout issues that have perplexed us for about 2 years. The picture below shows a large gap between modules that we encountered after a week in a warm, extremely dry toy store. The gaps between modules never exceeded a 1/16th of an inch before. Fortunately, none of the derailments damaged any rolling stock.



Jim Hediger – retired senior editor of Model Railroader magazine recently purchased a set of Division 1 n scale 50' ACY box cars. His written comments were as follows; "Nice job! Well done!" Via telephone he wanted to know when the HO cars might be available. Interesting?

Why not a Pulp and Paper Mill Part 6 – Last month, a flow diagram of the Kraft pulp and paper process was shown. This diagram was posted on the internet by U.S. Magnetol and covers the basic operations and components. Wood chips, white liquor (to be discussed later) and high pressure steam are introduced into the digester, a large pressure cooker, where wood fibers are separated from the lignin that binds fibers together. Turpentine byproducts are collected from the digester vent and loaded into tank cars for transport to a refinery. Pulp is drawn from the bottom of the digester and sent to washers where it is separated from weak brown liquor. Some brown liquor will foam and the foam is sent to a
