REPORT ON THE REGIONAL BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

Robert Ashley, Sr. and I attended the Mid-Central Region Board of Directors meeting on October 11, 2009 in Columbus, Ohio. The two primary pieces of business dealt with the new guidelines for contests from the NMRA and Regional finances.

NMRA has instituted new additions to the contest guidelines for the National Convention. The guidelines deal with allowing kit-built models (NOT kit-bashed, but kit-built models) into the contest to be judged and providing of awards for those models. These new model categories would be in addition to the standard categories, not replacing them. It was determined that the effect on the Regional contest would be to almost double the cost of awards and to almost double the judging time required for the contest. A motion was made to essentially continue to follow the guidelines that have been used in the past at the Regional Conventions. That motion passed.

With the purchase of local banks by PNC Bank, the checking account and the CD's for the Region ended up in the possession of a bank headquartered in Erie, PA. This has produced problems in changing the names on the accounts (signature papers) to the current office holders. Two motions were made and passed to alleviate the problem in the present and in the future. One placed the name of the former Treasurer on the list as Assistant Treasurer, which eliminates the current problem. The second motion placed the liaison to the State of Ohio concerning corporations on the signature papers. This name will continue on the signature papers to avoid future problems of this nature. It was further decided to move the CD's to a local bank when they mature.

Reports were received from all Divisions, from the various committees of the Region and from the past and upcoming Regional Convention hosts.

Host: Bob Ashley, Jr. Akron, Ohio The meeting was called to order at 2:03 PM by Superintendent David Hazlett. Fourteen people were in attendance. David Hazlett started the meeting by thanking Bob and his wife for hosting the meeting.

<u>Initial Business:</u>

- -A motion was made by Bill Hewitt to accept the minutes of the September meeting as published in the <u>Peddler Freight</u>. The motion was seconded by Kurt Sanders and passed.
- -The Treasurer's Report was given by Bob Ashley, Jr. A motion was made by Chuck Boyer to accept the report pending audit. The motion was seconded by Bob Ashley, Sr. and passed.
- -<u>Peddler Freight</u> we are now accepting subscriptions. The cost is \$15. There is no cost to receive it via e-mail. Currently, 25 people have subscribed for the hard-copy and 7 or 8 will be getting an e-mail.
- -There is concern not only on the National and Region level but on the Division level as well as, to what can be done to reverse the loss of members. One thing our division is doing is hosting the flea market and making it open to the public. Bob Ashley, Sr. has also been calling the people who have dropped off the master membership list and most say they will renew. Bob has also created the pamphlet on Division 1. Ron Wigal has been given the responsibility for the meeting schedule and membership and will be doing more follow-up.

The Assistant Superintendent's report was given by Bob Ashley, Sr.:

- -The 3rd annual holiday dinner will be on 12/19 at the Erie Station where it was held last year. The cost is \$20.75 per meal and it will be served in a dining car. Currently 25 people have signed up to go. Contact Bob if you would like to attend.
- -The current roster will be put in the <u>Peddler Freight</u> but will include only those people we are sure are NMRA members.

- -Clinics 02/21/09 Bob Weinheimer will talk about the 2010 regional convention and give a presentation on operation on the Pennsylvania Southern model railroad; 04/18/09 David Tilham will talk on coal fired power plants and equipment operation; 06/13/09 Chuck Boyer will give a modeling clinic
- -Modules currently there are 12 and Larry Brown is going to build several and involve youngsters in their construction

The Superintendent's Report was presented by David Hazlett:

Regional Board of Directors' meeting - kit-built modeling awards have been added to the contests at the national level but it was decided by the region due to cost and time constraints to <u>not</u> do likewise

- -The Regional Convention is May 13-16, 2010 in Charleston, West Virginia. At our February meeting Mr. Weinheimer will fill us in on this event and we will be able to register with him at that time if we would like.
- -Web site David is going to ask our web master, Alex Fleet, to give us some ideas on updating the look and feel of the site
- -David would eventually like to move the division to a tax status 501; we would need to put more emphasis on education which could be done by working with the Boy Scouts on their model railroading merit badge. He will look into this endeavor and get back to the membership.
- -You can request that the regional <u>Kingpin</u> be sent to you via e-mail like the <u>Peddler Freight</u>. Other business:

-Division 1's second annual flea market – currently 29 tables are sold with another 2 more possible. Bob

Ashley's wife, Twyla, aided by Karen Sanders, will run the concession stand. A \$2 donation will be asked for at the door. Children under 12 will be free. Setup will be 6 pm Saturday evening. Vendors can gain access to the room at 9 am Sunday morning. Several people are needed to help with the setup and cleanup and.
