This month's project started out with the need for some signs for a recently completed building. Since my layout is the Tropicana Northern you shouldn't be surprised that I needed signs for the fruit industry.

Remembering that my brother Mike Bradley made me some fantastic signs for my Tropicana plant, I thought, there's my source. Mike has a really nice printer and he knows how to use it! He very graciously agreed to help me. I sat down with Mike, he pushed a few buttons (Google) and before you know it there were hundreds of examples to choose from. We picked a few and printed them out on photo paper.

This whole project came primarily out of my scrapbox.

Following are the items needed:
- a reasonable well stocked scrapbox.
- a computer and printer or a really nice friend with both.

I cut four lengths of 1/4" square styrene. (that's what was in the scrapbox) I didn't want a flat two-sided sign.

Now make a square slightly smaller than the cut out signs. Use glue dots to mount the signs - Easy Peasy - you too can make great looking signs. Give it a try!

HO T-TRAK Modules displayed at Age of Steam

On Saturday December 14, members of MCR Division 1 exhibited the HO T-TRAK modular layout at the visitor center of the Age of Steam Roundhouse Museum in Sugarcreek, Ohio from 8:30 am to 1:30 pm. The Age of Steam was running their Santa Train which attracted a very large and enthusiastic crowd. We estimate that 200 - 250 children and adults viewed the layout either before or after their train ride and it was well received. Several of our members interacted with the kids allowing them to blow the engine horn or turn headlights on and off. Parents and grandparents alike, as well as AOS staff members, were very appreciative of our efforts.

Set up of the layout was facilitated by Lloyd Horst who went down to AOS on the prior Thursday to arrange the tables and set up the Rolling Command Station and necessary cables. Thanks in part to Lloyd's efforts, we had the layout up and running in just under two hours. This setup revealed a few kinks that need to be ironed out to help make our future setups run more smoothly. One of these is that not all the modules have the proper wiring to the power pole connectors. If you are in doubt about the wiring of your module, please bring it to the next meeting so that it can be checked. Other minor problems will be discussed at our next meeting. Hopefully events like this will motivate those of us who have not started or completed scenery for our modules to "get on track!" Thanks to everyone who participated in this event!

January 2025 Module Report

For 2024 the modules were only displayed twice. At the Route 30 Express in November and the Age of Steam's Christmas with Santa on December 14. The Route 30 Express setup was at the Wayne County Public Library in Wooster. I felt that we had a good turnout. The HO modules formed a complete layout and there was room for an even larger layout. The N scale modules were configured as a switching display as we do not have the corner modules completed.

We had 1-1/2 hours to set up before the public was admitted. Having plenty of help we proved that we can set up the modules the same day of a show providing we have 1-1/2 to 2 hours.

Division 1 has been invited back for 2025. The room in the library is large enough for us to display all of our modules in both scales. So in your planning for 2025 keep in mind the Route 30 Express and the need for all of our modules to be ready to go with scenery and bullet proof track and wiring. Bob Gurdak is writing about the Age of Steam event. Dan Condo of AOS is pleased with Division 1 and wants us back for 2025. The layout will be the same size of 8 feet by 13 feet.

At the Route 30 Express, there was some confusion on the correct way to use the bus cords and pigtails. This was due to the fact that I did not explain it properly. The pigtails are the taps to connect to the modules. To eliminate any confusion, I made sure the Power Poles were oriented correctly. Then I connected one pigtail to each bus cord in a permanent connection. Future bus cables will not have separate pigtails. The module taps will be permanently attached to each bus cable.

Bob Gurdak, Bruce Hukill, and I welcome your suggestions about local events in your area where we could display the Division 1 modules.
