T-TRAK Modular Group Report

I would like to thank everyone who participated in the narrow gauge train show in Salem. Gary was appreciative of our being there. Like Bruce said, it is a laid-back show and did not have a large number of public visitors. It was nice having a two-day show where you did not have to pack up at the end of the first day.

The N scale layout had two double modules and four singles. Without the corners, it was not as interesting as the HO layout. Initially, when setting up, I had some problems with the Loconet and the UR92 and getting the throttles to work. I think using batteries with low voltage was a factor. Also, one of the throttles may be defective.

One thing that we need to be aware of on our modules, is the correct track overhang at module ends. Below is a paragraph I copied from another clubs T-TRAK manual.

Correct track overhang at module ends:

T-TRAK modules are sized such that the track ends extend about 1mm or 1/16" at each end. It is extremely important at each track connecting to another module extend the same amount at each end if the track extensions are not identical then the module may have difficulty locking to the next module.

There were some problems with setting up the HO modules, but I will let Bob Gurdak tell that story.

I was very pleased with our meeting on Saturday. Everyone that was there joined in with comments and observations. One of them was that you should not get upset if a member points out a slight problem with your module. Take it in the spirit it is given to improve our layouts. Another good suggestion, was to have a time separate from the monthly meetings to set up both layouts and run trains. This would highlight areas that we need to improve on. Jerry Kruse said he knows of a place we could use that will accommodate the modules.

I will take the blame for the trouble of getting some of the modules to connect together. When the T-TRAK committee was formed, I had a Module Certification Form, that was to be completed for each module before it was allowed to be in a show. This is used to make sure all Division 1 modules meet the minimum standards. In the race to get set up at the Age of Steam, that fell by the wayside. This form will be revised and put into action for this fall .

Bob Gurdak, Bruce and I are working on venues for this fall. At the moment we are scheduled for the Route 30 Express in Wooster in November and the Age of Steam in December.

Track-work and wiring problems with a few modules still need to be addressed. These issues and others were discussed at a meeting we had that Saturday afternoon. Our goal is to streamline set-up time, and improve the operability of the layout, taking advantage of the KATO track that T-TRAK standards require. We also discussed using some sort of fabric valance to improve the overall appearance of the display. These ideas and others will be discussed at our upcoming Division meeting in April.

Finally, many thanks to all who participated in this event.

Tiny Decals - Big Difference

Sam's Easy Peasy

Many times the smallest details can make a big difference. Here is a use for those tiny decals that nobody uses. Think outside the box. Sometimes you need to disregard "what the decal says" – i.e. the original intent. What you want is something small with color.

Remember, you are dealing with a bunch of older guys whose eyesight is failing and always include the 3 foot rule! (you'll probably be viewing from about 3 feet away) Heck - most of them couldn't read it from one foot.

That's the idea; you don't (maybe shouldn't) read it. Your eye is "seeing something" familiar. Examples are data plates, instruction plates, etc. When was the last time you got down on your hands and knees to look at a data plate? (never)

Instruction plates/signs – BÈ CARÉFUL here – admitting to reading instructions may find you being asked to turn in your guy card... Guys don't read instructions... I hear maybe you want to take a sly glance if there is danger involved. That will usually be tipped off by a red or yellow sign/printing, skull and crossbones, etc., you get the idea. Better yet find someone else to test it out first.

We're getting off track here. What you are trying to do is bring attention to an otherwise mundane item. In the photo examples below,

the top photo show a plain

gray out of the box air conditioner, followed by an air conditioner painted a different color and finally an air conditioner painted a different color with small decals.

Other things to include are general information signs, safety signs, numbers, logos, etc. Every manufacturer wants their name out there on their product.

Sources – decal sets, also take a look at N scale decal sets. They are usually too small to read, but may be useful here. Yes Bruce, finally something useful in N scale. Sources you may not think of include labels off of fruits and vegetables, and even that sheet that your stamps come on from the post office. (That's real mail, not email)

Sam's Easy Peasy N scale Joke of the Month

Spring! When N scalers carefully nurture their rolling stock. Watering them, hoping that they will grow and blossom into a beautiful HO fleet. Avoid overwatering as they may go rogue and you'll end up with a barn full of O scale.

Decals can usually be found at any train show, for cheap. I also strongly suggest getting a bottle of micro scale liquid decal film. (\$4.50-ish)

What you will need:

- Small decals
- Sharp scissors or new number #11 blade
- Pointy tweezers
- Microscale Liquid Decal Film, restores old decals
- Small bowl with water
- Optivisor depending on your level of infirmity
- Since they are so small, you should be sure to seal with Dullcote.

As with most things I do, it's not rocket science, just TAKE YOUR TIME and practice. Remember, you only have to impress you! Everyone else will compliment you to be polite, regardless of the outcome. The more you do it, the more EASY PEASY it becomes.


