N-SCALE REPORT

Tank car unit trains passing through Louisville, OH were pulled by two diesel engines. The lead engine was a Canadian Pacific and the second engine was Union Pacific. I have seen this about 5 times in the last couple of months. Once again this proves that there is a prototype for everything, so if you need or want to operate different road name engines on your layout the rivet counters can pound sand. These engines were sooty and well weathered. Also saw a Wheeling and Lake Erie ten car hopper train being highballed by a BNSF diesel. Author is not sure but the diesels may have been SD series or U-Boats.

How did you like running HO at "Ages of Steam?" Operating on the HO modules had the same problems as N Scale modules. There was misaligned or broken track, coupler pins that caught on turnouts or curves, couplers height did not match, steam engine lead trucks that picked turnout points and short tender trucks that did the same, electrically actuated turnouts that fail to function and turnout points that were 5/64" higher than the rest of the track. All problems were hard to see and locate just like N scale. Regardless we were always

able to get two trains to operate continuously without incident.

Note the Shay is also available in N scale gauge. The author's interest in Nn3 is for a future timbering RR. But note that the Showcase Shay is available in N scale for an N scale operation. If you have or can find an Atlas N scale Shay you could also use them.




